Greg Boeh from GB Capital Holdings, and Bankers Hill homeowner,

The Maritime Museum has been a focal point of San Diego's waterfront since I was a child. Vividly I recall Her historic voyage on July 4, 1976, off the coast of Point Loma. Photos are still prominent around San Diego if you know where to look. I remember visiting the fishing vessels along the embarcadero with my father, who grew up pulling fish from the hulls of these vessels as a kid. Star of India in those memories.

Who would have thought that my life would be maritime focused and in part by my early exposure to the waterfront including the Maritime Museum.

Going to work for the Port, I remember the Maritime Museums storage on tenth Ave marine terminal in the old tuna processing warehouse. I would walk the warehouse and be engrossed with all the interesting items that were stored.

Years later, my children have all benefited from exposure to the museum. Several of them have sailed with me on the Star. We have stared out the living room window at the museum for several years. We visit at least once a year with a child and now I am excited to expose my grandchildren.

Running the embarcadero for the Port, I worked with the museum for years accommodating Tall Ship and other events. Worked with them for there expansion of the museum to the pierhead line. After leaving the Port, we continue to work with museum assisting maintaining gear through the San Diego Mooring Co. Still a large part of my life.

I am so pleased to see a plan presented that will allow the Maritime Museum to truly shine in our City. As neighbors with both the San Diego Mooring Co. and the Waterfront Mega Yacht facility you could not ask for a more considerate and respectful neighbor. The Maritime Museum promotes the maritime history that is so close to my heart and even more so to the mission of the Port in the maritime industry.

As the operator of several waterfront businesses and a home owner in the area, I urge the commission to fully support the Maritime Museum to continue its journey to be a relevant part of San Diego's maritime history by approving their conceptual plan and proceeding with the entitlements required to build out the new facility.
