<p>SAN DIEGO</p>	<p>Oversized vehicles are defined as any vehicle, including any attached trailers, vehicles or loads thereon that exceeds 27 feet in length AND 7 feet in height. House Cars (CVC Section 362); 4. Trailer coaches (CVC Section 635); 5. Mobile homes (CVC Section 396); 6. Boats and/or trailers, including jet skis and/or jet ski trailers; 7. Dune buggies and off-road or all-terrain vehicles and/or trailers; 8. Trailers used for the transportation of equipment, vehicles or animals; 9. Recreational vehicles (California Health & Safety Code Section 18010); 10. Folding camper trailers; 11. Any other motorized or towed vehicle designed, maintained or used primarily for recreational purposes.</p>	<p>No person shall park or leave standing any recreational vehicle, whether motorized or not, whether attached to motorized vehicle or not, at any time upon any highway, street, alley, public way, or public place except as otherwise allowed, in the City of National City except: 1. While a person is actively loading or unloading a recreational vehicle for a period not to exceed two hours; or 2. When the registered owner or lesser of a recreational vehicle is in possession of a permit issued pursuant to subsection 11.32.366. <p>IMPERIAL BEACH</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. "Recreational vehicle (RV)" means any trailer, camper, boat trailer, camper, mobile home, motor home, or similar vehicle (this is not meant to include vans or van conversions not exceeding an overall height of eight feet). 2. "Street" means and includes all streets, highways, avenues, lanes, alleys, courts, places, squares, curbs or other public ways in this City which have been or may hereafter be dedicated and open to public use, or such other property so designated in any law of this state. 2. Vans or Van Conversions less than overall height of 8' are excluded from "Recreational Vehicle" definition 	<p>On-Street Parking. It is unlawful to park a recreational vehicle for a period in excess of 48 hours on any street in the City. (Successive acts of parking within a two-tenth of a mile area shall be presumed to be a single act of parking). 1. The intent of this section is to allow recreational vehicle owners the use of the street, immediately adjacent to their private property, for the loading, unloading and general pre-trip/post-trip preparation generally associated with extended vacations only. The day-to-day parking and/or short-or long-term storage of the recreational vehicles on the street is specifically prohibited. 2. An encroachment permit may be granted by the City Manager or designee for the parking of recreational vehicles, which are suitable as temporary construction offices, etc., on</p>	

		<p>streets as long as these vehicles are parked immediately adjacent to the enterprise for which they are to service and are promptly removed when their reasonable use has expired. The term "temporary" and "reasonable" shall be that determined by the granting official.</p>	
<p>CORONADO</p>	<p>"Oversize vehicle" means a vehicle or combination of connected vehicles that exceeds 24 feet in length, is more than 95 inches in width, or has a manufacturer's gross vehicle weight rating in excess of 10,000 pounds.</p>	<p>Except as otherwise provided in this section, no person who owns or has possession, custody or control of any oversized vehicle shall allow such vehicle to remain stopped, standing or parked in one location upon any public street, alley, highway, including State highways, within the City for a period of time exceeding three consecutive hours. Relocating a vehicle, a distance of less than 500 feet from its original parking position shall not constitute a change of parking location for purposes of complying with this section. Exception. Any resident may park for a period of time not exceeding 48 hours for the purpose of loading or preparing for noncommercial purposes</p>
