# AGREEMENT BETWEEN SAN DIEGO UNIFIED PORT DISTRICT <br> and <br> AFTZ LLC for <br> CUSTOMS BORDER PROTECTION \& FOREIGN TRADE ZONE ACTIVATION AT TENTH AVENUE MARINE TERMINAL AGREEMENT NO. 89-2022RH 

The parties to this Agreement are the SAN DIEGO UNIFIED PORT DISTRICT, a public corporation (District) and AFTZ LLC, a California Limited Liability Company (Service Provider). The parties agree to the following:

1. SCOPE OF SERVICES. Service Provider shall furnish all technical and professional labor, and materials to satisfactorily comply with Attachment A, Scope of Services, attached hereto and incorporated herein, as requested by District. Service Provider shall keep the Executive Director of the District or their designated representative informed of the progress of said services at all times.
2. TERM OF AGREEMENT. This Agreement shall commence on January 1, 2023 and shall terminate on December 31, 2028, subject to earlier termination as provided below.
3. COMPENSATION. For performance of services rendered pursuant to this Agreement and as further described in Attachment B, Compensation and Invoicing, attached hereto and incorporated herein; District shall compensate Service Provider based on the following, subject to the limitation of the maximum expenditure provided herein:
a. Maximum Expenditure. The maximum expenditure under this Agreement shall not exceed $\$ 367,000.00$. Said expenditure shall include without limitation all sums, charges, reimbursements, costs and expenses provided for herein. Service Provider shall not be required to perform further services after compensation has been expended. In the event that the Service Provider anticipates the need for services in excess of the maximum Agreement amount, the District shall be notified in writing immediately.

District must approve an amendment to this Agreement before additional fees and costs are incurred.
b. Payment Procedure. For work performed on an hourly basis, Service Provider agrees to assign the person with the lowest hourly rate who is fully competent to provide the services required. If Service Provider finds it necessary to have work, which would usually be performed by personnel with a lower rate, performed by personnel paid at the higher hourly rate, Service Provider shall nevertheless, bill at the lower rate.
c. Progress Documentation. Service Provider shall provide District progress reports in a format and on a schedule as District directs. Progress reports shall include a description of work completed, cumulative dollar costs incurred, anticipated work for the next reporting period, percentage of work complete, and the expected completion date for remaining work. The report shall identify problem areas and important issues that may affect project cost and/or schedule. The report shall present actual percent completion versus planned percent completion.

## 4. RECORDS.

a. Service Provider shall maintain full and complete records of the cost of services performed under this Agreement. Such records shall be open to inspection of District at all reasonable times in the City of San Diego and such records shall be kept for at least three (3) years after the termination of this Agreement.
b. Such records shall be maintained by Service Provider for a period of three (3) years after completion of services to be performed under this Agreement or until all disputes, appeals, litigation or claims arising from this Agreement have been resolved, whichever is later.
c. Service Provider understands and agrees that District, at all times under this Agreement, has the right to review project documents and work in
progress and to audit financial records, whether or not final, which Service Provider or anyone else associated with the work has prepared or which relate to the work which Service Provider is performing for District pursuant to this Agreement regardless of whether such records have previously been provided to District. Service Provider shall provide District at Service Provider's expense a copy of all such records within five (5) working days of a written request by District. District's right shall also include inspection at reasonable times of the Service Provider's office or facilities, which are engaged in the performance of services pursuant to this Agreement. Service Provider shall, at no cost to District furnish reasonable facilities and assistance for such review and audit. Service Provider's failure to provide the records within the time requested shall preclude Service Provider from receiving any compensation due under this Agreement until such documents are provided.

## 5. SERVICE PROVIDER'S SUB-CONTRACTORS.

a. It may be necessary for Service Provider to sub-contract for the performance of certain technical services or other services for Service Provider to perform and complete the required services; provided, however, all Service Provider's sub-contractors shall be subject to prior written approval by District. The Service Provider shall remain responsible to District for any and all services and obligations required under this Agreement, whether performed by Service Provider or Service Provider's sub-contractors. Service Provider shall compensate each Service Provider's sub-contractors in the time periods required by law. Any Service Provider's sub-contractors employed by Service Provider shall be independent Service Providers and not agents of District. Service Provider shall insure that Service Provider's sub-contractors satisfy all substantive requirements for the work set forth by this Agreement, including insurance and indemnification.
b. Listed below are the firms that the District has approved as Service Provider's sub-contractors to provide services under this Agreement:

c. Service Provider shall also include a clause in its Agreements with Service Provider's sub-contractors which reserves the right, during the performance of this Agreement and for a period of three (3) years following termination of this Agreement, for a District representative to audit any cost, compensation or settlement resulting from any items set forth in this Agreement. This clause shall also require Service Provider's subcontractors to retain all necessary records for a period of three (3) years after completion of services to be performed under this Agreement or until all disputes, appeals, litigation or claims arising from this Agreement have been resolved, whichever is later.

## 6. COMPLIANCE.

a. In performance of this Agreement, Service Provider and Service Provider's sub-contractors shall comply with the California Fair Employment and Housing Act, the American with Disabilities Act, and all other applicable federal, state, and local laws prohibiting discrimination, including without limitation, laws prohibiting discrimination because of age, ancestry, color, creed, denial of family and medical care leave, disability, marital status, medical condition, national origin, race, religion, sex, or sexual orientation. Service Provider shall comply with the prevailing wage provisions of the Labor Code, and the Political Reform Act provisions of the Government Code, as applicable.
b. Service Provider shall comply with all Federal, State, regional and local laws, and district Ordinances and Regulations applicable to the performance of services under this Agreement as exist now or as may be added or amended.
7. INDEPENDENT ANALYSIS. Service Provider shall provide the services required by this Agreement and arrive at conclusions with respect to the rendition of information, advice or recommendations, independent of the control and direction of District, other than normal contract monitoring provided, however, Service Provider shall possess no authority with respect to any District decision.
8. ASSIGNMENT. This is a personal services Agreement between the parties and Service Provider shall not assign or transfer voluntarily or involuntarily any of its rights, duties, or obligations under this Agreement without the express written consent of Executive Director (President/CEO) of District in each instance.

## 9. INDEMNIFY, DEFEND, HOLD HARMLESS.

a. Duty to Indemnify, duty to defend and hold harmless. To the fullest extent provided by law, Service Provider agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the District, its agents, officers or employees, from and against any claim, demand, action, proceeding, suit, liability, damage, cost (including reasonable attorneys' fees) or expense for, including but not limited to, damage to property, the loss or use thereof, or injury or death to any person, including Service Provider's officers, agents, subcontractors, employees, ("Claim"), caused by, arising out of, or related to the performance of services by Service Provider as provided for in this Agreement, or failure to act by Service Provider, its officers, agents, subcontractors and employees. The Service Provider's duty to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless shall not include any Claim arising from the active negligence, sole negligence or willful misconduct of the District, its agents, officers, or employees.
b. The Service Provider further agrees that the duty to indemnify, and the duty to defend the District as set forth in 9.a, requires that Service Provider pay all reasonable attorneys' fees and costs District incurs associated with or related to enforcing the indemnification provisions, and defending any Claim
arising from the services of the Service Provider provided for in this Agreement.
c. The District may, at its own election, conduct its defense, or participate in the defense of any Claim related in any way to this Agreement. If the District chooses at its own election to conduct its own defense, participate in its own defense or obtain independent legal counsel in defense of any Claim arising from the services of Service Provider provided for in this Agreement, Service Provider agrees to pay all reasonable attorneys' fees and all costs incurred by District.

## 10. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS.

a. Service Provider shall at all times during the term of this Agreement maintain, at its expense, the following minimum levels and types of insurance:
(1) Commercial General Liability (including, without limitation, Contractual Liability, Personal Injury, Advertising Injury, and Products/Completed Operations) coverages, with coverage at least as broad as Insurance Services Office Commercial General Liability Coverage (occurrence Form CG 0001) with limits no less than one million dollars $(\$ 1,000,000)$ per Occurrence and two million dollars ( $\$ 2,000,000$ ) Aggregate for bodily injury, personal injury and property damage.
(a) The deductible or self-insured retention on this Commercial General Liability shall not exceed $\$ 5,000$ unless District has approved of a higher deductible or self-insured retention in writing.
(b) The Commercial General Liability policy shall be endorsed to include the District; its agents, officers and employees as additional insureds in the form as required by the District. An
exemplar endorsement is attached (Exhibit A, Certificate of Insurance, attached hereto and incorporated herein).
(c) The coverage provided to the District, as an additional insured, shall be primary and any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the District shall be excess of the Service Provider's insurance and shall not contribute to it.
(d) The Commercial General Liability policy shall be endorsed to include a waiver of transfer of rights of recovery against the District ("Waiver of Subrogation").
(2) Commercial Automobile Liability (Owned, Scheduled, Non-Owned, or Hired Automobiles) written at least as broad as Insurance Services Office Form Number CA 0001 with limits of no less than one million dollars $(\$ 1,000,000)$ combined single limit per accident for bodily injury and property damage.
(3) Workers' Compensation, statutory limits, is required of the Service Provider and all sub-consultants (or be a qualified self-insured) under the applicable laws and in accordance with "Workers' Compensation and Insurance Act", Division IV of the Labor Code of the State of California and any Acts amendatory thereof. Employer's Liability, in an amount of not less than one million dollars $(\$ 1,000,000)$ each accident, $\$ 1,000,000$ disease policy limit and \$1,000,000 disease each employee. This policy shall be endorsed to include a waiver of subrogation endorsement, where permitted by law.
(4) Professional Liability insurance in the amount of $\$ 1,000,000$ per claim and \$1,000,000 aggregate.
(a) At the end of the agreement period, Consultant shall maintain, at its own expense, continued Professional Liability insurance
of not less than five (5) years, in an amount no less than the amount required pursuant to this Agreement.
(b) Alternately, if the existing Professional Liability is terminated during the above referenced five-year period, Consultant shall maintain at its own expense, "tail" coverage in the same minimum amount as set forth in this paragraph.
(c) All coverages under this section shall be effective as of the effective date of this Agreement or provide for a retroactive date of placement that coincides with the effective date of this Agreement.
(5) Umbrella or Excess Liability insurance with limits no less than one million dollars $(\$ 1,000,000)$ per occurrence and aggregate. This policy must provide excess insurance over the same terms and conditions required above for the General Liability, Automobile Liability and Employer's Liability policies.
b. Service Provider shall furnish District with certificates of insurance coverage for all the policies described above upon execution of this Agreement and upon renewal of any of these policies. A Certificate of Insurance in a form acceptable to the District, an exemplar Certificate of Insurance is attached as Exhibit A and made a part hereof, evidencing the existence of the necessary insurance policies and endorsements required shall be kept on file with the District. Except in the event of cancellation for non-payment of premium, in which case notice shall be 10 days, all such policies must be endorsed so that the insurer(s) must notify the District in writing at least 30 days in advance of policy cancellation. Service Provider shall also provide notice to District prior to cancellation of, or any change in, the stated coverages of insurance.
c. The Certificate of Insurance must delineate the name of the insurance company affording coverage and the policy number(s) specifically
referenced to each type of insurance, either on the face of the certificate or on an attachment thereto. If an addendum setting forth multiple insurance companies or underwriters is attached to the certificate of insurance, the addendum shall indicate the insurance carrier or underwriter who is the lead carrier and the applicable policy number for the CGL coverage.
d. Furnishing insurance specified herein by the District will in no way relieve or limit any responsibility or obligation imposed by the Agreement or otherwise on Service Provider or Service Provider's sub-contractors or any tier of Service Provider's sub-contractors. District shall reserve the right to obtain complete copies of any of the insurance policies required herein.
11. ACCURACY OF SERVICES. Service Provider shall be responsible for the technical accuracy of its services and documents resulting therefrom and District shall not be responsible for discovering deficiencies therein. Service Provider shall correct such deficiencies without additional compensation. Furthermore, Service Provider expressly agrees to reimburse District for any costs incurred as a result of such deficiencies. Service Provider shall make decisions and carry out its responsibilities hereunder in a timely manner and shall bear all costs incident thereto so as not to delay the District, the project, or any other person related to the project, including the Service Provider or its agents, employees, or subcontractors.
12. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR. Service Provider and any agent or employee of Service Provider shall act in an independent capacity and not as officers or employees of District. The District assumes no liability for the Service Provider's actions and performance, nor assumes responsibility for taxes, bonds, payments or other commitments, implied or explicit by or for the Service Provider. Service Provider shall not have authority to act as an agent on behalf of the District unless specifically authorized to do so in writing. Service Provider acknowledges that it is aware that because it is an independent contractor, District is making no deductions from its fee and is not contributing to any fund on its behalf. Service

Provider disclaims the right to any fee or benefits except as expressly provided for in this Agreement.
13. ADVICE OF COUNSEL. The parties agree that they are aware that they have the right to be advised by counsel with respect to the negotiations, terms and conditions of this Agreement, and that the decision of whether or not to seek the advice of counsel with respect to this Agreement is a decision which is the sole responsibility of each of the parties hereto. This Agreement shall not be construed in favor of or against either party by reason of the extent to which each party participated in the drafting of the Agreement. The formation, interpretation and performance of this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of California.
14. INDEPENDENT REVIEW. Each party hereto declares and represents that in entering into this Agreement it has relied and is relying solely upon its own judgment, belief and knowledge of the nature, extent, effect and consequence relating thereto. Each party further declares and represents that this Agreement is being made without reliance upon any statement or representation not contained herein of any other party, or any representative, agent or attorney of any other party.
15. INTEGRATION AND MODIFICATION. This Agreement contains the entire Agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior negotiations, discussion, obligations and rights of the parties in respect of each other regarding the subject matter of this Agreement. There is no other written or oral understanding between the parties. No modifications, amendment or alteration of this Agreement shall be valid unless it is in writing and signed by the parties hereto.
16.

OWNERSHIP OF RECORDS. Any and all materials and documents, including without limitation drawings, specifications, computations, designs, plans, investigations and reports, prepared by Service Provider pursuant to this Agreement, shall be the property of District from the moment of their preparation and the Service Provider shall deliver such materials and documents to District at
the Don L. Nay Port Administration Building (located at 3165 Pacific Highway, San Diego, California 92101) whenever requested to do so by District. However, Service Provider shall have the right to make duplicate copies of such materials and documents for its own file, or other purposes as may be expressly authorized in writing by District. Said materials and documents prepared or acquired by Service Provider pursuant to this Agreement (including any duplicate copies kept by the Service Provider) shall not be shown to any other public or private person or entity, except as authorized by District. Service Provider shall not disclose to any other public or private person or entity any information regarding the activities of District, except as expressly authorized in writing by District.
17. TERMINATION. In addition to any other rights and remedies allowed by law, either party may terminate this Agreement at any time without cause by giving one hundred and eighty (180) days written notice to the other party of such termination and specifying the effective date thereof, at any time with cause by giving thirty (30) days written notice to the other party of such termination and specifying the effective date thereof, and the District may terminate this agreement immediately at any time only if the District chooses to terminate or close the FTZ by giving written notice to Service Provider of such termination and specifying the effective date thereof. In that event, all finished or unfinished documents and other materials shall at the option of District be delivered by Service Provider to the Don L. Nay Port Administration Building (located at 3165 Pacific Highway, San Diego, California 92101). Termination of this Agreement by as provided in this paragraph shall release parties from any further service, fee or claim hereunder other than a fee earned for services which were performed prior to termination but not yet paid.

## 18. DISPUTE RESOLUTION.

a. If a dispute arises out of or relates to this Agreement, or the alleged breach thereof, and is not settled by direct negotiation or such other procedures as may be agreed, and if such dispute is not otherwise time barred, the parties agree to first try in good faith to settle the dispute amicably by mediation administered at San Diego, California, by the American Arbitration

Association, or by such other provider as the parties may mutually select, prior to initiating any litigation or arbitration. Notice of any such dispute must be filed in writing with the other party within a reasonable time after the dispute has arisen. Any resultant Agreements shall be documented and may be used as the basis for an amendment or directive as appropriate.
b. If mediation is unsuccessful in settling all disputes that are not otherwise time barred, and if both parties agree, any still unresolved disputes may be resolved by arbitration administered at San Diego, California, by the American Arbitration Association, or by such other provider as the parties may mutually select, provided, however, that the Arbitration Award shall be non-binding and advisory only. Any resultant Agreements shall be documented and may be used as the basis for an amendment or directive as appropriate. On demand of the arbitrator or any party to this Agreement, sub-contractor and all parties bound by this arbitration provision agree to join in and become parties to the arbitration proceeding.
c. The foregoing mediation and arbitration procedures notwithstanding, all claim filing requirements of the Agreement documents, the California Government Code, and otherwise, shall remain in full force and effect regardless of whether or not such dispute avoidance and resolution procedures have been implemented, and the time periods within which claims are to be filed or presented to the District Clerk as required by said Agreement, Government Code, and otherwise, shall not be waived, extended or tolled thereby. If a claim is not timely filed or presented, such claim shall be time barred and the above dispute avoidance and resolution procedures, whether or not implemented or then pending, shall likewise be time barred as to such claims.
19. PAYMENT BY DISTRICT. Payment by the District pursuant to this Agreement does not represent that the District has made a detailed examination, audit, or arithmetic verification of the documentation submitted for payment by the Service Provider, made an exhaustive inspection to check the quality or quantity of the
services performed by the Service Provider, made an examination to ascertain how or for what purpose the Service Provider has used money previously paid on account by the District, or constitute a waiver of claims against the Service Provider by the District. The District may in its sole discretion withhold payments or seek reimbursement from the Service Provider for expenses, miscellaneous charges, or other liabilities or increased costs incurred or anticipated by the District which are the fault of or as result of work performed or negligent conduct by or on behalf of the Service Provider. Upon five (5) day written notice to the Service Provider, the District shall have the right to estimate the amount of expenses, miscellaneous charges, or other liabilities or increased costs and to cause the Service Provider to pay the same; and the amount due the Service Provider under this Agreement or the whole or so much of the money due or to become due to the Service Provider under this Agreement as may be considered reasonably necessary by the District shall be retained by the District until such expenses, miscellaneous charges, or other liabilities or increased costs shall have been corrected or otherwise disposed of by the Service Provider at no expense to the District. If such expenses, miscellaneous charges, or other liabilities or increased costs are not corrected or otherwise disposed of at no expense to the District prior to completion date of the Agreement, the District is authorized to pay for such expenses, miscellaneous charges, or other liabilities or increased costs from the amounts retained as outlined above or to seek reimbursement of same from the Service Provider. It is the express intent of the parties to this Agreement to protect the District from loss because of conduct by or on behalf of the Service Provider.

## 20.

## COMPLIANCE WITH PREVAILING WAGE LAWS (IF APPLICABLE).

a. Service Provider acknowledges and agrees that it is the sole and exclusive responsibility of Service Provider to: (a) ensure that all persons and/or entities (including, but not limited to, Service Provider or Subcontractors) who provide any labor, services, equipment and/or materials (collectively, "Services") in connection with any work shall comply with the requirements of California's and any other prevailing wage laws ("PWL") to the extent such laws are applicable and (b) determine whether any Services are
subject to the PWL by obtaining a determination by means that do not involve the District.
b. Certified Payrolls. Service Provider acknowledges and agrees that it is the sole and exclusive responsibility of the Service Provider to insure that all certified payrolls are provided to the District. Service Provider shall submit certified payrolls electronically via the software LCPtracker.
(1) LCPtracker is a web-based system, accessed on the World Wide Web by a web browser. Service Provider will be given a Log-On identification and password to access the San Diego Unified Port District's reporting system upon Service Provider's request.
(2) The use of LCPtracker by the Service Provider is mandatory. Access to LCPtracker will be provided at no cost to the Service Provider.
(3) In order to utilize LCPtracker, the Service Provider needs a computer and internet access. A digital camera and a scanner may be useful. For more information, go to www.Icptracker.com. To Login, go to www.Icptracker.net and from the homepage, select LOGIN and enter the Username and Password that will be provided to you by the District upon Service Provider's request.
(4) Use of the system will entail data entry of weekly payroll information including; employee identification, labor classification, total hours worked and hours worked on this project, wage and benefit rates paid etc. The Service Provider's payroll and accounting software might be capable of generating a 'comma delimited file' that will interface with the software.
(5) Service Provider must require all lower-tier sub participants the mandatory requirement to use LCPtracker to provide any required
labor compliance documentation. Lower-tier sub participants will be given a Log-On identification and password from the Service Provider.
(6) Training options can be provided to the Service Provider upon request.

## 21. SERVICE PROVIDER/CONTRACTOR REGISTRATION PROGRAM (IF

 APPLICABLE).a. In accordance with the provisions of Labor Code section 1771.1. (a) A contractor or subcontractor shall not be qualified to bid on; be listed in a bid proposal, subject to the requirements of Section 4104 of the Public Contract Code, or engage in the performance of any contract for public work, as defined in this chapter, unless currently registered and qualified to perform public work pursuant to Section 1725.5. It is not a violation of this section for an unregistered contractor to submit a bid that is authorized by Section 7029.1 of the Business and Professions Code or by Section 10164 or 20103.5 of the Public Contract Code, provided the contractor is registered to perform public work pursuant to Section 1725.5 at the time the contract is awarded.
b. No contractor or subcontractor may be listed on a bid proposal for a public works project (submitted on or after March 1, 2015) unless registered with the Department of Industrial Relations pursuant to Labor Code section 1725.5 [with limited exceptions from this requirement for bid purposes only under Labor Code section 1771.1(a)].
c. No contractor or subcontractor may be awarded a contract for public work on a public works project (awarded on or after April 1, 2015) unless registered with the Department of Industrial Relations pursuant to Labor Code section 1725.5.
d. This project is subject to compliance monitoring and enforcement by the Department of Industrial Relations.
22. CAPTIONS. The captions by which the paragraphs of this Agreement are identified are for convenience only and shall have no effect upon its interpretation.
23. EQUAL OPPORTUNITY EMPLOYMENT. Service Provider represents that it is an equal opportunity employer, and it shall not discriminate against any subconsultant, employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, national origin, handicap, ancestry, sex, gender, gender expression, sexual orientation, or age. Such non-discrimination shall include, but not be limited to, all activities related to initial employment, upgrading, demotion, transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination.

Service Provider will, within forty-five (45) days of the effectiveness of this Agreement, provide a written statement of its commitment to diversity, equity, and inclusion, which shall include a commitment and brief description of its plan to implement good faith efforts to recruit subconsultants and employees in a nondiscriminatory manner. If Service Provider fails to provide such written statement as required, the District may terminate this Agreement, effective immediately, by providing written notice of such termination. Service Provider shall, not later than sixty (60) days prior to the expiration of each anniversary of the effective date of this Agreement, provide a written report describing Service Provider's actions and results in furtherance of its commitment to diversity, equity, and inclusion, as well as provide an updated Employment \& Ownership Report in the form attached hereto as Exhibit B, or updated form provided by District. Service Provider's report shall not identify individual subconsultants and employees by name. If Service Provider fails to provide such report and/or Exhibit B, as required, the District may terminate this Agreement, effective immediately, by providing written notice of such termination.
24. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S SIGNATURE. It is an express condition of this Agreement that said Agreement shall not be complete nor effective until signed by
either the Executive Director (President/CEO) or Authorized Designee on behalf of the District and by Authorized Representative of the Service Provider.

## ATTACHMENT A SCOPE OF SERVICES

## San Diego Unified Port District

A. Services. Service Provider shall provide the following services:

1. Assist in preparing the site for full implementation of the FTZ Activation and maintenance of this Activation process. Service Provider shall also coordinate and submit U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP or Customs) related items to CBP with concurrence of the Grantee.
2. On-going review of the Procedures Manual detailing the Inventory Control and Recordkeeping System (ICRS). Service Provider will maintain the Procedures Manual to meet the requirements outlined in Part 146 of the 19 CFR. The Procedure Manual will provide an explanation of any special procedures that may be requested by customers or FTZ Users. All changes to the Procedures Manual must be approved by District.
3. Coordinate any required on-site inspection of the facility for CBP security checks and provide advice on the determination of the appropriate areas to activate; and assist to develop the layout map indicating those areas.
4. Participate in the orientation meeting with local CBP officers and/or regulatory audit personnel for development of CBP familiarity of the ICRS. Any operational questions or concerns will be addressed by the Service Provider. District and Service Provider shall maintain a document of Work Instructions for the District that outlines the day to day procedures for the FTZ. The Work Instructions shall include physical security elements and the Custom's compliance elements required to management the FTZ. The Work Instructions will also include the Work Instructions to be distributed to the FTZ Users outlining the required documentation and processes for delivering merchandise in Zone bonded status.
5. Assist the District in the development of general Cost Benefit Analysis (CBA) process. The District shall be able to work with prospective FTZ Users or customers to receive the data elements necessary for the completion of the CBA. This will also provide the District a defined marketing process and training of the promotion of the FTZ and the space for lease by the District within the FTZ.
6. Oversee and prepare compliance reviews, monthly and annual reports. Service Provider shall also provide support to the District via teleconference and on-site meetings. District access to inventory, receiving and shipping reports available through password access via 3PL FTZ Management Solutions software.
7. Service Provider shall handle CBP request for information or penalties including those from other Partner Government Agencies (PGA). District to review and approve these documents prior to submission.
8. Oversee compliance and procedures for the District.
9. Provide FTZ management software and consultation services for compliance including:
a. FTZ Board
b. Reconciliation
c. Systems Review
d. Certification Letter
10. Provide consulting to assist in the preparation of the following:
a. Procedures Manual detailing the Inventory Control and Recordkeeping System (ICRS)
b. Work instructions for day-to-day procedures for operating the FTZ
c. Manage services for ICRS via 3PL FTZ software
11. Assist or directly provide services for responses to the following (after District review and approval):
a. Liquidated Damages and Mitigation Procedures
b. Grant of Permit Infractions
c. Fines, penalties, and CBP notices
12. Service Provider to accompany the District on CBP spot checks, both site visits and inventory audits
13. Keep abreast of regulatory changes and requirements
14. District is responsible for securing a FTZ Customs Bond
15. District is responsible for renewal of the FTZ status with the Grantee
16. Meetings between the District Representative and Services Provider will be scheduled quarterly or upon written agreement to:
a. Identify likely new FTZ targets
b. Review financial performance
c. Review available data on the FTZ trends in the industry
17. Service Provider will propose a general list of services and FTZ User rates. The rate structure will be flexible to allow for different types of scenarios or shipments. The intent is to provide a competitive rate structure for securing new business. Final selection of services and rates shall be made by the District.
18. Service provider shall ensure that all FTZ User fees are tracked and verified through the FTZ Management Software.
19. Service Provider shall furnish all vehicles, equipment, tools and materials used to provide the services required by this Agreement. Unless set forth herein, District shall not require Service Provider to rent or purchase any equipment, product or service as a condition of entering into the resulting Agreement.

## ATTACHMENT B COMPENSATION \& INVOICING San Diego Unified Port District

## 1. COMPENSATION.

a. For the satisfactory performance and completion of the services under this Agreement, District shall pay Service Provider compensation as set forth hereunder.
(1) Service Provider shall be compensated and reimbursed by District on the basis of invoices submitted each month for services performed during the preceding month.
b. Manage Service Provider - Set Up Fee: The amount charged by Service Provider for FTZ User's (customers) to be set up under their 3PL FTZ Management Solutions software system.
c. Monthly Services Fee: Monthly amount that Service Provider will receive to perform services listed under Item Attachment A - Scope of Services.
d. Client/User Fees
(1) Client/User set up fee: $\$ 3,500$ per user, one-time (life time) set up with their unique FTZ Admission number sequence for Inventory controls, reports and FTZ ICRS compliance.
(2) One-time or single time Client/User (non-repeating), $\$ 350$ set up fee under generic FTZ Admission number sequence for Operator Inventory controls, reports and FTZ ICRS compliance.

Note: Set up fees are a cost to the Client/User, not the District.
e. Monthly Services Fee: Monthly minimum fee $\$ 6,000$.

Monthly fee and transactions fee are billable to the San Diego Unified Port District, whereas the District bills their client plus a commission. Transaction Fees to the District:
\$20 base rate and negotiable on user volume.

b. Service Provider shall include the following information on each invoice submitted for payment by District, in addition to the information required in Section 1, above:

3) The following certification phrase, with printed name, title and signature of Service Provider's project manager or designated representative:

c. District shall, at its discretion, return to Service Provider, without payment, any invoice, which has been submitted without the above information and certification phrase.

e. Should District contest any portion of an invoice, that portion shall be held for resolution, but the uncontested balance shall be processed for payment. f. Service Provider shall submit all invoices within thirty (30) days of completion of work represented by the request and within sixty (60) days of incurring costs to be reimbursed under the Agreement. Payment will be made to Service Provider within thirty (30) days after receipt by District of a proper invoice.

These managers receive directions from the Executive/Senior Level management and typically lead major business units. They implement policies, programs, and directives of executive/senior management through subordinate managers and within the parameters set by Executive/Senior Level management. Examples of these kinds of managers are vice presidents and directors, group, regional or divisional controllers; treasurers; human resources, information systems, marketing, and operations managers. The First/Mid-Level Officials and Managers subcategory also includes those who report directly to middle managers. These individuals serve at functional, line of business segment or branch levels and are responsible for directing and executing the day-to-day operational objectives of enterprises/organizations, conveying the directions of higher-level officials and managers to subordinate personnel and, in some instances, directly supervising the activities of exempt and non-exempt personnel. Examples of these kinds of managers are: first-line managers; team managers; unit managers; operations and production managers; branch managers; administrative services managers; purchasing and transportation managers; storage and distribution managers; call center or customer service managers; technical support managers; and brand or product managers.
- Professionals: Most jobs in this category require bachelor and graduate degrees, and/or professional certification. In some instances, comparable experience may establish a person's qualifications. Examples of these kinds of positions include accountants and auditors; airplane pilots and flight engineers; architects; artists; chemists; computer programmers; designers; dieticians; editors; engineers; lawyers; librarians; mathematical scientists; natural scientists; registered nurses; physical scientists; physicians and surgeons; social scientists; teachers; and surveyors.
- Technicians: Jobs in this category include activities that require applied scientific skills, usually obtained by post-secondary education of varying lengths, depending on the particular occupation, recognizing that in some instances additional training, certification, or comparable experience is required. Examples of these types of positions include drafters; emergency medical technicians; chemical technicians; and broadcast and sound engineering technicians.
- Sales Workers: These jobs include non-managerial activities that wholly and primarily involve direct sales. Examples of these types of positions include advertising sales agents; insurance sales agents; real estate brokers and sales agents; wholesale sales representatives; securities, commodities, and financial services sales agents; telemarketers; demonstrators; retail salespersons; counter and rental clerks; and cashiers.
- Administrative Support Workers: These jobs involve non-managerial tasks providing administrative and support assistance, primarily in office settings. Examples of these types of positions include office and administrative support workers; bookkeeping; accounting and auditing clerks; cargo and freight agents; dispatchers; couriers; data entry keyers; computer
operators; shipping, receiving and traffic clerks; word processing and typists; proofreaders; desktop publishers; and general office clerks.
- Craft Workers: Most jobs in this category include higher skilled occupations in construction (building trade craft workers and their formal apprentices) and natural resource extraction workers. Examples of these types of positions include boilermakers; brick and stone masons; carpenters; electricians; painters (both construction and maintenance); glaziers; pipe layers; plumbers, pipe fitters and steamfitters; plasterers; roofers; elevator installers; earth drillers; derrick operators; oil and gas rotary drill operators; and blasters and explosive workers. This category also includes occupations related to the installation, maintenance and part replacement of equipment, machines, and tools, such as: automotive mechanics; aircraft mechanics; and electric and electronic equipment repairers. This category also includes some production occupations that are distinguished by the high degree of skill and precision to perform them, based on clearly defined task specifications, such as millwrights, etchers, and engravers; tool and die makers; and pattern makers.
- Operatives: Most jobs in this category include intermediate skilled occupations and include workers who operate machines or factory-related processing equipment. Most of these occupations do not usually require more than several months of training. Examples include textile machine workers; laundry and dry-cleaning workers; photographic process workers; weaving machine operators; electrical and electronic equipment assemblers; semiconductor processors; testers, graders, and sorters; bakers; and butchers and other meat, poultry, and fish processing workers. This category also includes occupations of generally intermediate skill levels that are concerned with operating and controlling equipment to facilitate the movement of people or materials, such as: bridge and lock tenders; truck, bus, or taxi drivers; industrial truck and tractor (forklift) operators; parking lot attendants; sailors; conveyor operators; and hand packers and packagers.
- Laborers: Jobs in this category include workers with more limited skills who require only brief training to perform tasks that require little or no independent judgment. Examples include production and construction worker helpers; vehicle and equipment cleaners; laborers; freight, stock, and material movers; service station attendants; construction laborers; refuse and recyclable materials collectors; septic tank services; and sewer pipe cleaners.
- Service Workers: Jobs in this category include food service, cleaning service, personal service, and protective service activities. Skill may be acquired through formal training, jobrelated training, or direct experience. Examples of food service positions include cooks; bartenders; and other food service workers. Examples of personal service positions include medical assistants and other healthcare support positions; hairdressers; ushers; and transportation attendants. Examples of cleaning service positions include cleaners; janitors; and porters. Examples of protective service positions include transit and railroad police and fire fighters; guards; private detectives and investigators.
